ARF WE GROWING?

Everyone taking the assessment was asked to rank themselves on a scale from 1 to 10 on the trend of their growth over the last 12 months in these key areas. A ranking of 1 to 5 indicates regression and a ranking of 6 to 10 indicates growth in that area.

DISCIPLESHIP CULTURE. Α

Most statistics tell us that 20% of church attenders do 80% of the ministry. While serving in the church within various programs is helpful, the reality is that less than half of church ministry is directly engaged in intentionally discipling people in both the character and skill of Jesus. This means that statistically in the U.S. less than 10% of church goers are either intentionally discipling others or being discipled themselves. Churches that have a plan for discipleship and are seeing more than 10% of their people in these relationships are leading the way out of this discipleship crisis in the western church.

ANALYSIS & OBSERVATIONS

STRENGTHS

46% of our population have been attending Grace from five years or less. This is an increase of 6% over last year. We are still reaching and retaining new people.

The age demographic in our congregation is still very diverse, showing notable growth in the 18-29 age group (2.5%). This could be attributed in part to the launching of FORM, our young adult internship program and the spiritual growth within our high school students.

12% of respondents recorded attending our north site location. This is a growth of 3% over last year. God seems to be blessing this step of faith to reach out to this area.

We've seen an overall increase in attendance in the past twelve months (7%).

While the numbers of those being discipled and discipling others may initially seem low, the reality is that our statistics compared to the Western Church would indicate that Grace is well above the curve in this regard. George Barna has noted that 20% of Christians are involved in some sort of discipleship activity nation wide. 43% of our population are receiving intentional investment from another disciple. 37% are intentionally investing in others. Though we have a long way to go in the journey toward every believer responding to the command to "go and make disciples," we celebrate where we are today.

Our four questions on spiritual growth indicate that most attenders feel they have grown in the area of sharing life (65%, up 3%), family growth (81%, up 3%), leadership influence (74%, steady), and character growth (86%, up 2%). Overall, these numbers indicate a Grace is a body of believers that desires growth in his/her relationship with God and others.

WEAKNESSES

Almost 57% of those surveyed are not being intentionally discipled on a regular basis by anyone. This is an increase of 8% over last year's data. Similarly, a majority of our congregation are NOT intentionally investing in others (63%) – a 1% increase over last year. It is difficult to do more than speculate on the hindrances here.

While Grace is a very spiritually seasoned and maturing congregation (84% have been following Jesus for five years or more), we are experiencing limited breakthrough in new believer growth (5%).

18% of surveyors are new attenders to Grace Gathering. 5% of those are new to faith within the last 12 months. This means 13% of our new attenders have come for other reasons. Although this can signal good things, we would like the number to reflect more people coming to faith.

Over half (51%) of our congregation are not pursuing mission within a community of people sharing life together.
